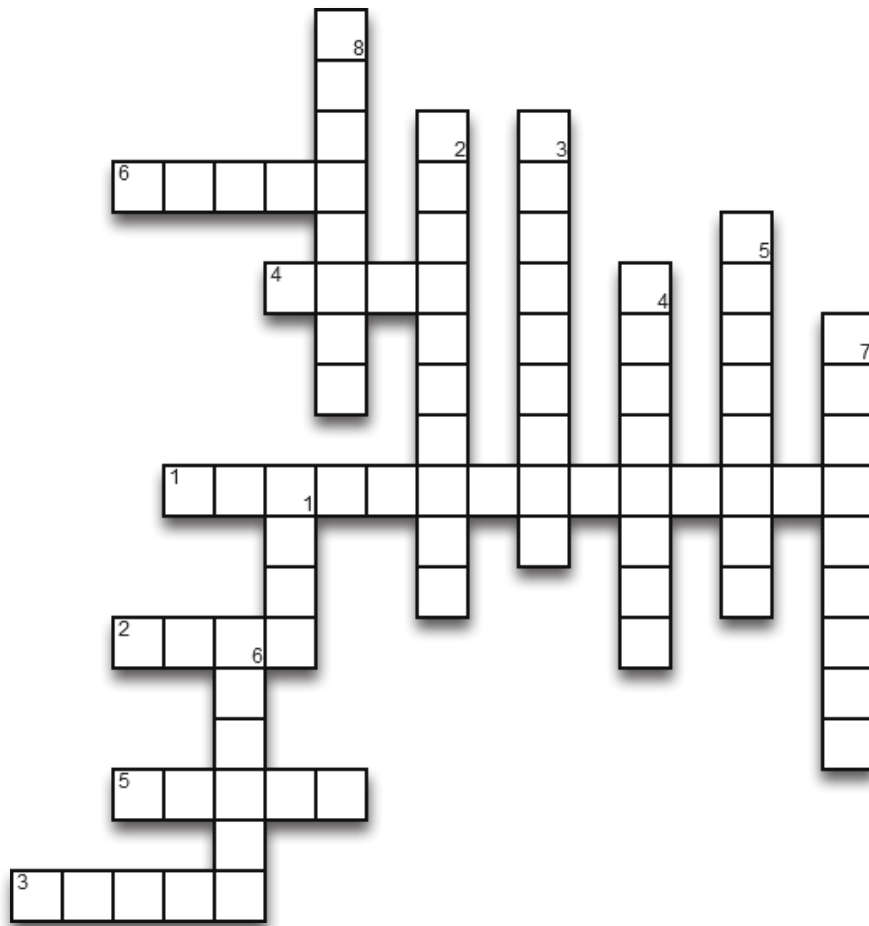


# Reducing UF's Waste-Line

## ACROSS

1. Defined as: "Meeting contemporary needs without compromising the ability of future generations to satisfy their needs."
2. UF's goal is to reach this amount of waste
3. 16,000 tons (or 32 million pounds) of this is generated by the UF campus each year
4. When you recycle paper, and also purchase paper made with recycled content, you are doing what is known as "Closing the \_\_\_\_\_"
5. The second of the "three r's"
6. This recyclable material makes up 20% of UF's trash

## DOWN

1. Red cups popular at tailgates and parties that are not recyclable in Alachua County
2. Process of breaking down organic matter like food and yard waste
3. Lightweight material often used for coffee cups, plates, packaging, etc. (It is not recyclable and takes more than 5,000 years to degrade)
4. Soda can material that can be recycled indefinitely
5. Place where trash that isn't recycled ends up
6. The first of the "three r's"
7. The process of converting materials into reusable objects to prevent waste of potentially useful material
