  - a. Lauren Berkow
    - i. UF Health Earth Day is coming up next week
  - b. Wilcley Lima
    - i. Foodservice Master Plan is underway
      - 1. Good response rate to survey
      - 2. Expecting a report by mid-summer
      - 3. Expect to have ITN ready for fall 2019/spring 2020
- 2. Office of Sustainability Update
  - a. Campus Earth Week events last week were successful overall
    - i. Office will be reviewing the events in the coming weeks and welcomes sustainability committee member input to improve future events
  - b. Collection Day is 4/24 in the O'Connell Center parking lot
    - i. Items accepted can be found at sustainable.ufl.edu
    - ii. Allison Vitt will send out information to committee members
  - c. Jacob Adams has been hired as Campus Bicycle Program Coordinator and will no longer act as support staff for the Sustainability Committee
  - d. Field and Fork Fresh Off The Farm event taking place tomorrow from 4:30-7:00pm
    - i. Food from campus gardens will be available as prepared by UF Culinary Arts Student Union
  - e. We Are Neutral's Earth Day Event is taking place at Depot Park on Sunday

- f. Earth Day at Fresh Food Company on campus takes place on Tuesday next week
- g. City Bag Ban update Matt Williams
  - i. City Commission has moved the implementation date to January 1, 2020 to investigate specific details identifying which bags will be banned and how to identify acceptable bags
  - ii. The straw component is still going into effect in August 2019
  - iii. County has had a first reading of their similar ordinance; it was passed last week
    - 1. Second reading expected at next meeting; expected to pass as well
- h. City Fertilizer Ban
  - i. Fertilizer ban will now be in effect with only February-March open for fertilization
- 3. Elect New Chair
  - a. John Duncan's tenure on the committee ends in August; a new Chair should be nominated and elected
  - b. Provided a brief description of the duties of the Chair
    - i. Will attend infrastructure council meetings
    - ii. Coordinate with Office of Sustainability
    - iii. Oversee Sustainability Committee meetings, agendas, priorities
  - c. Ariel Pomputius; with the current direction of the committee towards the support of a campus as a living lab program, how might the chair's role change?
    - i. Matt Williams; no specific change or achievement expected; should evaluate living lab components, guide committee in reviewing programming, review other campus programs

      - 1. No expectation beyond a single year; new election each year

- 5. Update on Reitz Union Composting Station Wilcley Lima
  - a. Slides attached

- b. Composting has been taking place in back-of-house dining operations and postconsumer at dining hall locations
  - i. Challenge for Reitz Union is to encourage consumers to effectively sort their compost
- c. Discussion of challenges:
  - i. Packaging
  - ii. Encouraging customer sorting
  - iii. Pickup logistics
  - iv. Funding
    - 1. Some has been provided by Pepsi for sustainability initiatives
  - v. Scheduling
- d. Will implement signage, liquid separation, student volunteers, and social media/online engagement to improve outcome
- e. Program inspired by Carleton University in Ontario, Canada
- f. Location/design; see slide deck
  - i. Will guide customers through 4 steps to properly sort waste
  - ii. Question; what does a "clean" pizza container look like?
    - 1. As in Alachua county, must be free of grease/cheese/food; can tear box apart to recycle clean parts
  - iii. Question: Should bottle caps be removed?
    - 1. Ideally caps should be removed and sorted to the waste bin
    - 2. May install a cap receptacle at the sink station
  - iv. Question: Could this potentially serve as a model in the community as well?
    - 1. Yes a successful pilot could be rolled out to a larger audience
    - 2. Liz Storn; the Office of Sustainability is working on materials for other units on campus to guide better waste disposal
    - 3. In Alachua County there is already online messaging to aid in sorting properly
  - v. Will have educational video slides on monitors mounted near station
  - vi. Will use Leanpath program/hardware to assist in data collection and display
    - 1. Currently being installed in campus dining halls
    - 2. John Duncan: request to install in Arredondo Room
  - vii. Question: will there be any educational materials explaining composting vs recycling?
    - 1. Yes, it will be included in video slides at the station
  - viii. Question: will compostable silverware be implemented?
    - 1. May be brought on for the future, not currently in use
  - ix. Question: Will there be an evaluation of the success of the educational materials?
    - 1. Will be looking at the success of the sorting/contamination rates

- A waste audit was completed in 2014/15 on the Reitz Union second floor of landfill waste; can compare potential compostable materials with rates achieved by new program
- 3. May also be data available from O'Connell Center composting/waste diversion program
- g. Will be implementing the program Monday, May 13 for start of Summer A term
- h. Invitation to the committee to organize a tour for members to see the Leveda Brown Transfer Facility to help understand Alachua County's waste system
  - i. Allison Vitt will assist with organization
